

STUDIES IN PHILOSOPHY, ETHICS, AND RELIGION offer a unique and interdisciplinary approach to exploring the fundamental questions of life and existence. This field of study focuses on the beliefs, values, and principles that guide human behavior, as well as the philosophical and religious systems that shape our understanding of the world.



Through the study of philosophy, you will engage in deep and critical thinking about a wide range of topics, including ethics, epistemology, and the nature of reality. You will learn about the major philosophical schools of thought and their approaches to solving some of life's biggest questions. You will also gain a strong understanding of logic and critical thinking skills.

The study of ethics and religion provides students with a comprehensive education in the moral and spiritual beliefs that have shaped societies and cultures throughout history. You will learn about the major religious traditions and their historical, cultural, and philosophical roots. Additionally, you will explore ethical and moral questions related to issues such as justice, equality, and human rights.

By combining the study of philosophy, ethics, and religion, you will develop a unique perspective on the world and your place in it. This interdisciplinary approach will help you to understand the interplay between philosophy, ethics, and religion, and to see how they shape our beliefs and values.

Graduates with a background in philosophy, ethics, and religion can pursue a variety of careers, including law, education, journalism, government, and the non-profit sector. Additionally, many graduates go on to further study in areas such as theology, law, or psychology.

Studies in English are paid. The tuition fee is 4300PLN/1000 EUR per semester. There are some minor additional costs to be covered, such as the recruitment fee and the student's ID card cost.

Mandatory courses are offered in the form of lectures, seminars, and workshops. In some cases, a course may be composed of a combined form of these options. Electives:

The Academic Seminar is held every week during the course of studies. It assists our students in writing their Master's thesis and prepares them for further academic activities.

Monographic Lectures:

During each semester of the academic year, two monographic lectures are offered by our faculty members. New lectures are given every year and are announced before the beginning of the new term. Monographic lectures reflect the current research that is being conducted by members of the faculty and are meant to deepen the philosophical knowledge of our students.
